Pre-Recorded Interview with Galaxy Resources Ltd Managing Director I Tggyan(*). WA based mining company, Galaxy Resources has signed a deal with US based K2 Energy for planning technology used for the manufacturing of batteries. Galaxy Resources has a lithium mine in Ravensthorpe and has long-term plans to use the minerals to manufacture lithium batteries in China. It hopes to enter the Chinese battery powered bike market. Tggyan explains how they hope to convert some of the lithium carbonate to lithium iron batteries. He explains K2 is a rapidly growing company that have developed 'interesting' lithium batter technology around the lithium iron phosphate material. Compere says WA is starting to mine significant different minerals in WA currently. He suggests people will be aware of the gold and iron ore industries. Tggyan says in WA there are three companies involved with lithium like Telson(*), Galaxy Resources. He explains Reed Resources is developing a project near Kalgoorlie. He says the prospect for lithium as a mineral is 'very strong.' He explains lithium is a non-toxic and environmentally friendly battery. He explains Galaxy Resource are proceeding with the detailed design and have appointed German company MW Group.

RAVENSTHORPE lithium miner Galaxy Resources has signed a technology licence agreement with the well-established US-based lithium ion battery producer K2 Energy Solutions.

Under the Agreement, K2 Energy will provide Galaxy with battery technology expertise, licensing and commercial support for the construction and operation of Galaxy's proposed Jiangsu battery manufacturing plant in China.

Galaxy managing director Iggy Tan welcomed the prospect of K2 Energy as a technology partner for Galaxy's prospective battery plant.

"Ensuring that we will be able to complete construction and operation of the Jiangsu Lithium Carbonate plant in accordance with our revised timetable is our first priority, nonetheless this licence agreement is important preparatory work for our proposed pipeline battery project," Mr Tan said. "It is one of many important milestones the Galaxy board has set the company before it approves the final battery project.

"Galaxy will have the unrestricted and unlimited use of specific K2 Energy lithium battery technologies, valuable for the E-bike and other battery markets."

Galaxy sparks up

Galaxy Resources shares jumped 3.5¢ to 74.5¢ as investors welcomed good news from the lithium player, which has signed a deal to advance its battery ambitions. Although Galaxy has yet to approve plans for a lithium battery plant — its focus is on completing a lithium carbonate plant in China — it said the technology licence agreement with US lithium ion battery producer K2 Energy Solutions was an "important milestone". Under the agreement, K2 would provide "expertise, licensing and commercial support" to the WA group if it goes ahead with the battery project.
